

Spatial development

Spatial information is obtained through touch and movement and hearing (smell) and typically depends on the balance of convergent information from all sources.

(Millar, 1994)




Pre reading concepts:

top, bottom, left, right, top left, top right, bottom left, bottom right, middle, above, below, front, back, first, last, second, same, behind, in front, at the site, in the middle, next, centre left, middle right, short, long, up, down, letter, word, line, sentence, sound, page, reading direction (from left to right)

The Braille House with the size of a young child's torso






